

Transition to American Culture and Language for International Students

Nonnative, English-speaking students new to Phillips Exeter Academy should consult with the Dean of Students Office to determine whether they are suitable candidates for this course. It is designed to facilitate the transition to a demanding academic program of reading, writing, and discussion for students for whom English is not their first language.

TRN100: TRANSITION TO AMERICAN CULTURE AND LANGUAGE

This interdisciplinary course is solely for students from other cultures who have oral proficiency in English and who seek to further develop their writing and discussion skills. Participants write many essays with multiple revisions and explore various aspects of the Exeter curriculum. The students also learn from each other about world cultures and form an international circle that provides support for their special concerns, as well as an introduction to seminar-style participation. The class may read British as well as American works, but the chief focus remains American culture. *Open to Juniors, Lowers, Uppers, and Seniors. Offered: Fall Term.*
