

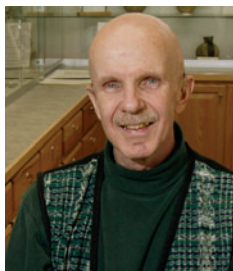
RECOMMENDED READING

Looking for a good book to read in 2007? We decided to check in with some well-read Exeter faculty members, to learn which books have captured—and held—their interest recently.



BRIAN CROWLEY

Rick Schubart, Exeter’s Bates-Russell Distinguished Faculty Professor and a past chair of the history department, has been busy coordinating the Harkness 75th celebration. Still, he found time to recommend *Team of Rivals: The Political Genius of Abraham Lincoln* by Doris Kearns Goodwin; *The World Is Flat [Updated and Expanded]: A Brief History of the 21st Century* by Thomas L. Friedman; and *State of Denial: Bush At War, Part III* by Bob Woodward and *The New American Militarism: How Americans are Seduced by War* by Andrew J. Bacevich—both of which, he notes, “should be required reading given the current state of affairs.”

During his fall 2005 sabbatical, **Don Foster**, the Dr. P. Phillips Professor of Anthropology, visited villages and museums in the Black Forest to enhance his understanding about the traditions of food production in southern Germany. Noteworthy books he read during his sabbatical include *The Culture of Fear: Why Americans Are Afraid of the Wrong Things* by Barry Glassner; and *Authentic Fakes: Religion and American Popular Culture* by David Chidester. Since then, Foster has enjoyed *The Articulated Peasant: Household Economics in the Andes* by Enrique Mayers; *1491* by Charles Mann; *The Fortune at the Bottom on the Pyramid* by C. K. Prahalad; and *The Clash of Civilizations: Remaking of the World Order* by Samuel Huntington.

In 2006, **Ellen Wolff**, the Eleanor Gwin Ellis Instructor, published her first book, *An Anarchy in the Mind and in the Heart: Narrating Anglo-Ireland*. In addition, she recently finished *Weep Not, Child* by Ngugi wa Thiong’o; *Virginia Woolf: Icon* by Brenda Silver; *Call It Sleep* by Henry Roth; *Great Granny Webster* by Caroline Gordon; *The Master: A Novel* by Colm Toibin; and *The Story of Lucy Gault* by William Trevor.

Her colleague in the English department, **Peter Greer ’58**, included the following books on his reading list: *Blue Water* by A. Manette Ansay, a George Bennett Fellow at Exeter during the 1992-93 school year; *Four Corners: A Journey into the Heart of Papua New Guinea* by Kira Salak; *To See Every Bird on Earth: A Father, a Son, and a Lifetime Obsession* by Dan Koeppl; and *Will in the World* by Stephen Greenblatt.

Rich Aaronian, who teaches biology and is the Harlan Page Amen Professor, spent part of his 2005-06 sabbatical in the Peruvian Amazon studying the breeding behavior of birds inhabiting the jungle along the Tuoyahao River. Clements and Noam Shany; *Tropical Nature: Life and Death in the Rain Forests of Central and South America* by Adrian Forsyth and Ken Miyata; and *Journey of the Pink Dolphins: An Amazon Quest* by Sy Montgomery.
