This July, several new administrators whose appointments were announced earlier this year officially assumed their new roles.

Exeter's new dean of students is **Dan Morrissey**, a faculty member at Exeter from 1994 until 2004 and

most recently dean of residential life at the Baylor School in Chattanooga, TN. While at Exeter, he was an instructor in sports science, an athletic trainer, dorm head of Browning, an associate dean of students in the summer school for three years and director of summer athletic programs for three years.

At Baylor, Morrissey was credited with bringing order and direction to the school's residential program. His work has led to improved enrollment at Baylor, and to numerous speaking invitations from national and regional organizations, including, in the past year alone, The Association of Boarding Schools, the National Association for College Admission Counseling and the Illinois Math and Science Academy Conference for Residential Faculty. He also continued his teaching as an instructor in human physiology and in Baylor's wellness/leadership program.

Morrissey earned his B.S. from Boston University and his M.Ed. from the Antioch New England Graduate School.

Joining Morrissey in the Dean of Students office is Dean of Academic Affairs **Jane Cadwell**, whose chief

responsibilities are students' academic programs and schedules. She will work with student advisers, and serve as chair of the Academic Advising Committee and as a resource for parents who have questions about their child's academic schedule or performance.

Cadwell earned her B.A. from Williams College, her M.A.T. from Smith College and her M.Litt. from Middlebury.

She joined the Exeter English department in 1993, and has served on a wide range of academic and administrative committees, including academic advising, admissions, discipline, dorm heads (she served as dorm head of Bancroft) and both the Lamont Poet and Bennett Fellow committees. She has coached both tennis and squash, and served as an adviser to Exeter's Surfing Club. She is also a member of the Exeter Humanities Institute faculty.

Eric Bergofsky brings more than 30 years' worth of classroom and administrative experience to his new position as director of studies. A member of Exeter's mathematics department since 1977, he is a past director of Exeter's Anja S. Greer Conference on Secondary School Mathematics, Science and Technology, and the founder and director of the Exeter Mathematics Institute, which every summer sends teams of Exeter faculty around the country to conduct weeklong, onsite workshops with math teachers in major metropolitan areas.

Together with the Curriculum Committee, which he will chair, Bergofsky is charged with initiating and coordinating curricular change, encouraging communication among departments on issues of teaching and learning, and promoting and maintaining interdisciplinary courses, including Junior Studies, Senior Studies and senior projects. He is also working with Assistant Principal Tom Hassan to prepare a reaccreditation report for a visiting committee from the New England Association of Schools and Colleges.

Bergofsky earned both his B.E.S. and his M.Ed. from Johns Hopkins University, and his M.S.T. from UNH. His experience as captain of Johns Hopkins' national championship lacrosse team became the foundation for his 30-year coaching career with Exeter's boys lacrosse team.

This summer also marks the beginning of a new chapter for longtime faculty member and administrator **Denis Brochu**, who has been named resident director of the School Year Abroad's campus in Rennes, France.

Brochu joined the modern languages department in 1983 as a French instructor. In 1993, he became the associate dean of students for academic affairs; in 2001, he became dean of academic affairs. He served as dorm head in both Amen and Browning, and for more than 20 years served as PEA's coordinator of SYA programs. He also directed Exeter's summer program in France. In the summer of 2005, he joined 15 other Exeter faculty members for a three-week trip to China sponsored by the East-West Center.
