During the spring term, two new appointments to the dean of faculty's office were announced and two new professorships awarded.

Mark Delaney is the new director of studies, succeeding Stephen Kushner. Delaney earned his B.A. from Emory and Henry College and an M.A. from American University, and joined the Academy's English department in 1987. A past recipient of the Brown Family Faculty Award, he also served as a member of the Academy's Curriculum Review Committee.

Another member of the Curriculum Review Committee, Ronald Kim, has been named associate dean of faculty, succeeding Susan Keeble. Kim, who joined the history department in 1994 and was named the Stone Instructor in the Humanities in 2001, earned his B.A. from the University of California at Berkeley and his M.A. from the University of Chicago. In 1998, he received the Academy's Charles E. Ryberg Award.

John Herney '46, '71 (Hon.), who joined the Academy's history department in 1968 and served as dean of faculty from 1995 to 2000, has been named the Robert Shaw White Professor in History. Herney earned his B.A. from Dartmouth and his M.A.T. from Harvard. During his career at the Academy, he has received numerous teaching awards, including both the Brown Family Faculty Award and three Radford Faculty Fellowships.

The new Arthur A. Seeligson '39 Professor in Business, Economics and History is Michael Milligan, a member of the Academy's history department since 1991. Milligan holds a B.A. from the University of Toronto, and an M.A. and a Ph.D. from the University of Virginia. He is a past winner of both the Ryberg Award and the Brown Family Faculty Award.
