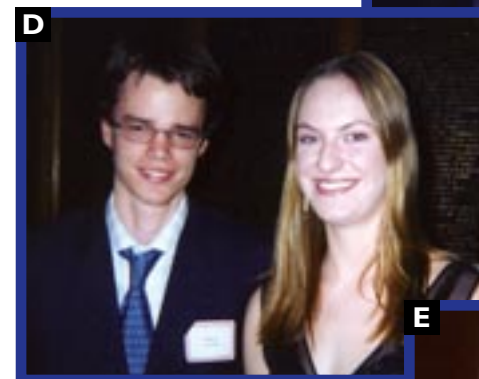

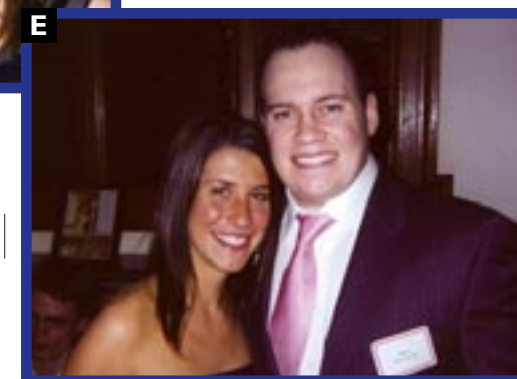

HO JOHN LEE '80,
CLASS AGENT AND CLASS PAGE EDITOR

Ho John Lee '80, who has been a class agent for 15 years, is also the class page editor for the class of '80 web page at <http://phillips.exeter.edu/classoff/1980>. The page includes news and information about class activities such as the recent reunion, contact information for class officers and links to other class data on the alumni/ae website, as well as links to additional content, photo and interactive discussion areas on a companion class site at <http://www.exeter80.org> that Lee hosts from Palo Alto, CA.

Lee, who attended Exeter for three years on scholarship, volunteers as a class agent because, he says, "I want to help Exeter make a space for another person like me. It was a gift to be able to go there and encounter the teachers and peer group that I did." For Lee, this meant encountering others who

were exceptionally good at things, and often better at them than he was. "Exeter gave me a set of peers to talk with, to argue with, to collaborate with," he says. Since his family moved frequently when he was growing up, that peer group became very important to him. The value he places on those connections is behind Lee's service as a class page editor.

Lee's long-standing interest in collaborative and communication technology grew in part out

of his research projects on early web media services at Hewlett-Packard Laboratories. He attributes the fact that he regularly bumps into other Exonians to geography, frequent travel and the nature of his current work as a consultant and adviser to new businesses. Since not everyone shares those circumstances, Lee sees the Internet as a space where this kind of serendipitous and casual, but important, interaction can happen. "What makes Exeter valuable as an institution is the strength of the community it builds around it," he says. "Exeter selects an interesting group of people and brings them together, helps them find each other when they wouldn't have otherwise. They create a community that continues to exist after they leave PEA.

"Because Exeter focuses on combining goodness and knowledge, you learn to think about how to apply yourself in a way that will actually help people," says Lee, who is also involved in technology projects overseas that will bring valuable health, agricultural, education and job opportunities to very poor, rural areas. While the needs of the Exeter alumni/ae community are very different, Lee believes they are both well served by Internet technology. "I hope I can help create a space that will draw in those who don't have a strong connection to the school or to the class, and expand the circle of classmates and friends who participate in our community."
