NEW BOOK SHELVES

People often come in to the library looking for a relatively new book they've just heard about or read a review about. Searching BIBLION for the title will always let you know if we have it, or if the item is on order. The Library also provides access to lists of new materials in a number of ways.

On the library's home page, under "Related Links" (left side of the page), selecting "New Titles in the Library" will direct you to several additional links. For instance, at this writing, the lists are: Videos in the Music Library; New Works on Lincoln, and New Fiction – Vacation Reading. Selecting any of these links directs you to the actual records in BIBLION for the individual items. Then all you have to do is note the location of the item and retrieve it.

Every month or so Eileen Cusick creates a selected list of New Titles in the Library. This paper list is available at the main circulation desk, and distributed to individuals on-, and off-campus who request it.

Recently, Marilyn Bott has instituted a new process of placing a selection of new titles on the two book racks in front of the old card catalog. The records in BIBLION for the new materials that are placed on these racks, show "New Book Shelves" as the location.

This means that a "Call # search" (last option in the pull-down list) for "New Book Shelves" in the BIBLION search box will result in a complete list of all the materials that are currently on the two book racks. The items are not in any particular order on the list, but at least once can see, at a glance, the "selected new books."

If you still don't find a particular item you are looking for remember that you may always "suggest new library materials" by using the link under Online Requests on the library home page.
