FIONA MCFARLANE, GEORGE BENNETT WRITER IN RESIDENCE, TO READ

On Thursday, May 21, 2009, at 7 p.m., Fiona McFarlane, recipient of the 2008 George Bennett Fellowship will read from her work. Sponsored by the Friends of the Academy Library, the reading will take place in the Kaplanoff Periodicals Room in the Library. A reception will follow.

Born in Sydney, Australia, McFarlane earned a bachelor's in English from Sydney University, and a doctorate in American literature from Cambridge University. Before coming to Exeter, she spent two years as a fiction fellow at the Fine Arts Work Center in Provincetown, MA. Her work has been nominated for a Pushcart Prize and a National Magazine Award in fiction, and she has received funding from the Australia Council for the Arts and the Harper-Wood Studentship in English Literature. McFarlane's stories have been published in *Zoetrope: All-Story*, *Southerly*, *Island*, and Cambridge University's *Mays Anthology*, and produced for radio in Australia and the United Kingdom.

FATHER-SON PHOTO EXHIBIT

The Library is pleased to present an exhibit of nature photography through the eyes of a father and son— Ty Tingley and his son Morgan '99. The photos are primarily of wildlife and were taken during travels to locations around the world. According to Morgan, "some of these places we have traveled to together, allowing us to shoot the same subjects in different ways, but many we have traveled to separately -- providing a global sampling of biodiversity through our collections."

TYLER C. TINGLEY 13TH PRINCIPAL 1997-2009: an exhibit honoring his leadership.

It is nearly impossible to represent, in approximately seventy-seven square feet of space, the contributions and long-term effects of the leadership of Tyler C. Tingley, Exeter's 13th principal. The materials in the current Library exhibit represent general themes of the period of Ty's administration.

The first half of the exhibit covers: Academy master planning, conversations about Harkness teaching, curriculum review, the Exeter [fund raising] Initiatives, the development of new summer programs for adults, and the development of a new program for younger students in the Exeter Summer School.

The second half of the exhibit covers: the changes that have been made to employee benefits, programs established to improve the security of our campus; programs established to extend the concepts of the Harkness classroom into all aspects of a student's life outside the classroom; efforts to enhance "connections" made between students, their peers, and the adults in the community; the transformation of the landscaping on campus; the construction or renovation of several major buildings; the purchase or construction of numerous new homes for faculty; and the historic decision to offer an Exeter education to qualified students with family incomes of \$75000 or less. The last two sections cover Mr. Tingley's English course "Fellowship and Fantasy" as well as his interest in fishing. One final case treats the contributions that Marcia Tingley has made to the Exeter community.

SENIOR BOOKMARKS

Since the spring of 1993, the Library has invited seniors to contribute lists of their favorite books for bookmarks used to encourage life-long reading. The bookmarks are made available at the Circulation Desk and in the Admissions Office. This year, 45 seniors contributed lists.
