## EQUITABLE EXETER EXPERIENCE



As Principal William Rawson '71; P'08 says at the beginning of every opening assembly, students do their best at Exeter when they feel that they belong here. Helping students create that sense of belonging is what drives the Equitable Exeter Experience program (E<sup>3</sup>). We know that some students, particularly those with underrepresented identities at Exeter, take a little longer to feel like Exeter is their home. E<sup>3</sup> is designed to help students find community as soon as they arrive on campus, by giving them opportunities to engage with faculty, learn about campus resources and connect with peer-to-peer mentors.

## WHAT IS E<sup>3</sup>?

E<sup>3</sup> is a pre-orientation program that serves four populations of first-year students who are underrepresented at Exeter: students of color, students with high financial need, students who will be the first in their families to attend college, and students who are members of the LGBTQ+ community. The program is optional and runs concurrently with other preorientation programs such as international student orientation. preseason athletics and student leadership training.

In the summer before they matriculate, invited students who register for the program are each paired with a peer mentor. Mentors are past E<sup>3</sup> participants who can answer questions about what to expect at Exeter, and who stay in touch throughout the year to provide support and fellowship. Once E<sup>3</sup> participants arrive on campus, they move into their dorm rooms; day students see their affiliated dorms and library carrels, and the day student lounge. The next three days are spent meeting teachers and trying Harkness classes, forming friendships, and being introduced to campus resources like the Office of Multicultural Affairs (OMA), Counseling and Psychological Services and The Learning Center.
